  - c) He Was Harsh and Cruel. (Ex 1:15-16)
  - d) He Died Before the Exodus. (Ex 2:23)
- 3. He Was as Harsh and Cruel as his Predecessor. (Ex 2:23; 3:7)
- 4. He Would Have Known Moses.
